Annotated provisional agenda

1. Joint opening of the eighth session of the Statistical Commission for Africa, the eighth meeting of the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa, and the expert segment of the sixth session of the Conference of African Ministers Responsible for Civil Registration

The joint segment will begin at 9 a.m. (Addis Ababa time (UTC+3)) on Monday, 24 October 2022, at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa. The session will begin with welcoming remarks by the Director of the African Centre for Statistics, which is the secretariat of the three meetings.

That will be followed by statements delivered by the Chairs of each of the three Bureaux, the ECA Executive Secretary a.i., followed by special guests.

The session will be opened officially with an address delivered by a senior official of the Government of Ethiopia.

The joint session will continue with a keynote address delivered by the Minister of Lands, Housing and Urban Development of Uganda, Chris Baryomunsi.

Lastly, three special guests who have been invited as discussants will provide comments on the keynote address.

6. Joint session of the Statistical Commission for Africa and the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa

In this session, focus will be placed on the strong connections between geospatial information and statistics. It will begin with a key note address on the contribution made by geospatial information to the dissemination of statistics.

That will be followed with presentations by representatives of African countries relating the experience of their countries in that area.

7. Joint session of the Statistical Commission for Africa and the expert segment of the sixth session of the Conference of African Ministers Responsible for Civil Registration

The session will emphasize the role of civil registration in complementing the gaps in statistics, referring to examples of practices currently deployed in Africa in the production and use of civil registration-based vital statistics. This will be followed by a panel discussion on the status of and experiences in the digitalization of civil registration and vital statistics systems.

8. Reports on pre-events

The organizers of the pre-events held on 22 and 23 October will provide oral reports on the proceedings and outcomes of those events. The ensuing discussion will provide session participants an opportunity to table two to three key recommendations during the plenary sessions of the Statistical Commission for Africa.
