Statistical programme of the Economic Commission for Africa: statutory issues

Proposed programme plan for 2025 under subprogramme 4, Data and statistics

I. Objective

1. The objective of subprogramme 4, Data and statistics, is to strengthen the production, dissemination and use of credible data, statistics and geospatial information at the national, regional and global levels for evidence-based policymaking and decision-making.

II. Strategy

- 2. To contribute to the objective of the subprogramme, the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) will:
- (a) Support African national statistical systems in transforming their data governance and management methods by digitalizing the collection, compilation and dissemination of data for statistical purposes, including censuses and civil registration systems, and provide technical assistance and training in the design and implementation of national strategies for the development of statistics and national spatial data infrastructure with related integrated geospatial information frameworks;
- (b) Maintain and regularly update publicly accessible databases, providing harmonized data, statistics and geospatial information disaggregated by location on such topics as African economies, demographics, social indicators, the environment, and other statistics needed for monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and Agenda 2063: The Africa We Want, of the African Union;
- (c) Provide training and make platforms available for the exchange of best practices among its members and their respective national statistical agencies;

- (d) Integrate policy advice and sustained capacity-building activities on data, statistics and geospatial information to support its members in enhancing the monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063:
- (e) Enhance communication with its members on the benefits of using statistics and geospatial information.
- 3. The above-mentioned work is expected to result in:
- (a) Improved capacity, resilience and efficiency of national statistical systems, including greater uptake of innovative tools and technologies to collect comparable statistics at various levels of disaggregation, and improved statistical operations, including in censuses, surveys, the processing and analysis of administrative data and the dissemination of up-to-date data;
- (b) Improved uptake of geospatial information management, closer collaboration between components and stakeholders of the national spatial-data infrastructure, and better-integrated geospatial information frameworks;
- (c) Enhanced monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063.


III. Programme performance in 2023

Census improvements driven by digital applications

- 4. The implementation of digital censuses mitigated the challenges faced by African countries, including the impact of coronavirus disease (COVID-19), budgetary constraints and insecurity in some parts of the continent. Digital applications developed under the subprogramme increased the operational efficiency of censuses and allowed census data to be made available about three months after completion of the fieldwork. Such applications have improved the quality of census data and enhanced the potential for geospatial analysis. Countries have deployed devices to improve data collection processes, as well as applications under field monitoring systems, systems to track issues encountered in the field, and project management toolkits for their censuses and have disseminated their results. In 2023, three members of ECA (Namibia, Senegal and Zimbabwe) received support under the subprogramme for conducting digital censuses.
- 5. Progress towards the aforementioned objective is presented in figure I.

Performance measure: number of members of the Economic Commission for Africa that improved the quality and timeliness of censuses through technology (cumulative)




IV. Planned results for 2025

A. Result 1: progress towards digital transformation and the modernization of statistical systems

- 6. Thanks to the work carried out under the subprogramme, three additional members of ECA (Madagascar, Mozambique and Uganda) implemented the road map on digital transformation and modernized their official statistics in 2023, bringing the cumulative number of countries to have implemented the road map to 11, well above the target of 5 countries.
- 7. Progress towards the overall objective and towards the target for 2025 are presented in figure II.

Performance measure: number of ECA members to have implemented the road map on digital transformation and modernized official statistics (cumulative)



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
B. Result 2: production and dissemination of comparable economic statistics by members of the Commission

- 8. Thanks to the work carried out under the subprogramme, five additional members of ECA (Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, Nigeria and Senegal) have adopted and applied the recommended international standards and methodology on economic statistics. This brought the cumulative total to 37, falling short of the planned target of 39. The target was not met because it took considerable time to adopt and implement the 2008 System of National Accounts in the five countries mentioned above, since they had to wait for the completion of the research and global consultation phases. As a result, ECA was unable to cover other members under the subprogramme.
- 9. Progress towards the objective and the target for 2025 are presented in the performance measure below (see figure III).

C. Result 3: progress towards integrated statistical and geospatial information frameworks

- 10. The Global Statistical Geospatial Framework provides a standardized approach for integrating statistical and geospatial information, enabling a more comprehensive understanding of social, economic and environmental phenomena. It is anchored in the overarching Integrated Geospatial Information Framework, which provides the coordination and standards necessary to deliver integrated geospatial information. The subprogramme has been supporting members of ECA as they adopt strategic pathways in the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework to improve their national statistical frameworks and address the challenges they face in the collection, processing, analysis and dissemination of data.
- 11. From its implementation of the subprogramme, ECA learned that countries needed support in collecting data at a level of granularity that was sufficient for the data to be analysed and applied to evidence-based policymaking. They also needed support in harmonizing their methodologies so that they would be able to adopt the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework. In applying these lessons, ECA will support its members in using emerging technologies to collect and map geospatial


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data at the subnational level, in improving their data-collection workflows, including by using volunteered geographic information systems on utilities and infrastructure in urban areas, and in establishing a mechanism to standardize geographic coordinate systems for comparability within and across countries. Its efforts will foster the integration of statistical and geospatial data and the universal availability of all data.
