Information note for participants

The ninth session of the Statistical Commission for Africa, the tenth meeting of the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa and the fourth Expert Forum for Producers and Users of Disaster-related Statistics will be held in parallel at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa from 28 October to 1 November 2024. The present document contains general information on meeting arrangements that may be helpful for those making travel arrangements and participating in these events.

In order to keep costs down and protect the environment, the present information note will be available in electronic format only. Overview

The ninth session of the Statistical Commission for Africa will run in parallel with the tenth meeting of the Regional Committee and the fourth Expert Forum.

Preliminary events and side events will be held on 26 and 27 October 2024 at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa, located in the ECA compound. The fourth Expert Forum will be held from 28 to 30 October, with side events on 31 October and 1 November.

The ninth session of the Statistical Commission for Africa and the tenth meeting of the Regional Committee will bring together directors of African national statistics offices, representatives of regional economic communities and regional statistics training centres, heads of national mapping agencies and pan-African institutions, and various partners in statistical and geospatial information development.

Visa and immigration requirements

All participants travelling to Ethiopia must hold a passport that is valid for a minimum period of six months from the date of intended entry and contain at least two consecutive empty visa pages.

To assist participants in obtaining visas upon their arrival at Addis Ababa Bole International Airport, the secretariat will need to receive the following documents no later than 14 October 2024:

- Copy of passport
- Flight details (arrival and departure information)

Name of hotel booked

Participants who intend to request a visa upon arrival at Addis Ababa Bole International Airport should carry with them their personal official letter of invitation and a copy of the note verbale listing the participants, for presentation to the airline staff at the check-in desk at the airport of departure and to the immigration authorities of Ethiopia upon arrival. The application fee for a single-entry 30-day conference visa is \$52. For additional information on conference visas, see <u>www.evisa.gov.et/information/conferenceVisa</u>.

For the issuance of journalist visas, the application procedure is the same as described above. For a single-entry 30-day journalist visa, the application fee is \$152. For additional information on journalist visas, see www.evisa.gov.et/information/journalistvisa.

ECA will send a note verbale to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Immigration Nationality and Vital Events Agency of Ethiopia to facilitate the issuance of visas upon arrival for all confirmed participants. The note verbale will be shared with confirmed participants to support their request for a visa. In order for a name of a participant to be included in the note verbale, the secretariat requires a copy of the participant's passport as soon as possible.

For sponsored participants, it should be noted that visa fees are covered in the daily subsistence allowance and will not be reimbursed.

Holders of diplomatic and service passports or a United Nations laissezpasser will receive a visa upon arrival free of charge.

Bank receipts for money exchanged at the airport must be kept secure, as they may be requested by officials at the airport upon departure.

Airport reception

Officers from the ECA Protocol and Liaison Services Unit will be available at the airport to provide participants with assistance as needed, for example, in relation to immigration formalities or luggage retrieval. The airport is located close to the city centre.

Airport transfer

Participants should contact the hotel at which they have chosen to stay to arrange transfer from the airport to the hotel.

There are no daily transport arrangements to and from the meeting venue, and participants are responsible for organizing their own transportation.

Hotel accommodation

All participants travelling to Ethiopia must contact hotels directly to arrange, confirm and guarantee their bookings. Negotiated, special United Nations rates for hotel rooms are available for participants staying at the hotels listed in annex I to the present information note. The deadline for confirming reservations at those hotels is 14 October 2024. Reservations that have not been confirmed by that deadline will be released. The hotels will then accept accommodation requests only on the basis of room availability. All participants are kindly requested to note that ECA will not be in a position to arrange hotel accommodation if they fail to make their own arrangements beforehand directly with the hotel of their choice.

Participants do not need to register for all three events; registration for any of the events allows participants to gain access to the Conference Centre, where they may attend any event of their choice. Participants are encouraged to register well in advance and no later than 14 October 2024 to ensure that credentials and visas can be processed and that badges can be issued as quickly as possible.

Badges

To access the venue, participants are required to have a valid badge that must be presented to gain entry. Badges will be issued from 25 to 31 October 2024 at the registration counter, which is located at gate 2 of the ECA compound.

For security reasons, badges must be displayed at all times. If participants lose their badge, they should immediately report the loss at the registration counter.

Facilities and services

Accommodation for persons with disabilities

In the spirit of inclusion, as contained in the Sustainable Development Goals, the organizers will take measures to make the venue accessible for persons with disabilities. Internet connectivity and paper-smart approach

ECA will adopt a paper-smart organizational approach for the events. Participants are strongly encouraged to use electronic media as much as possible, and every effort will be made to reduce the number of documents printed. To help to achieve that objective, high-density wireless connectivity will be made available at the venue. The Wi-Fi name and password will be made available in visible locations in the Conference Centre.

Participants attending the events in person are advised to bring their own devices (e.g. laptop computers, tablet computers or smartphones) to download and view the documents.

Working languages

The working languages of the events are English and French.

Practical information

Currency

The official currency of Ethiopia is the Ethiopian birr. One United States dollar is equal to approximately 107 birr. Credit and debit cards, such as American Express, Diners Club International, Mastercard and Visa, are accepted in Ethiopia. Automatic teller machines are also available.

Electricity supply and voltage

The electricity supply in Ethiopia is 220 V with a frequency of 50 Hz alternating current. Plug types C and F are used, as depicted in the figure.

Mobile phone services

Ethio Telecom and Safaricom are the main mobile phone companies in the country that offer prepaid SIM cards, and they have roaming agreements with partners in many countries. Any purchaser of a SIM card must be registered in order to activate the card. Registration can be done at the time of purchase. Participants will need to show their passports when purchasing a SIM card from authorized vendors. SIM cards and credit can be purchased at the airport or venue.

Health requirements

Addis Ababa is located at an altitude of approximately 2,400 m (7,874 feet) above sea level, which may induce altitude sickness in some people. Individuals who have experienced altitude sickness in the past should consider whether they must travel to Addis Ababa. Alternatively, participants should consult their physician to obtain appropriate medication for the condition. The risks related to altitude sickness are higher for people with multiple health problems (comorbidities) and can result in serious health consequences. Individuals should discuss their health issues with their physician before embarking on the trip.

Participants are advised to ensure that their vaccinations are up to date at least four to six weeks before travelling to Ethiopia. Vaccination against yellow fever is required for travellers who have departed from or transited through a country with a risk of yellow fever transmission within six days before arriving in Ethiopia. Participants are requested to check the validity of their vaccination card and update it accordingly.

Participants arriving in Ethiopia from certain countries are also advised that, under Ethiopian mpox regulations, they are required to complete, before their arrival at the public health screening counters in Addis Ababa Bole International Airport, a travel health declaration form, which is available from a dedicated web page. Since the list of affected countries is subject to change, depending on the evolution of the public health situation, participants are advised to check whether the country from which they are arriving in Ethiopia is one of those affected, using a dedicated page of the Ethiopian Airlines website. A medical team with an ambulance will be on standby at the Conference Centre to provide first aid, emergency care and stabilization. Participants who develop serious medical emergencies can then be transferred to one of the hospitals or medical centres in Addis Ababa listed in annex II to the present document.

The United Nations Health Care Centre, which is located on the premises of the ECA compound, is open 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Outpatient care and emergency services, including ambulance services, are provided to participants throughout the duration of the events. The Centre can be reached through the following emergency number, either by calling directly or through WhatsApp: +251 92 990 8433. All services at the United Nations Health Care Centre are provided on a fee basis.

Security advisory

Addis Ababa is a relatively safe city for travellers and conference activities. The Government of Ethiopia will provide adequate security support at the venue and hotels. Participants and visitors are advised to remain securityconscious, stay alert and vigilant, maintain a low profile, avoid going anywhere alone when possible, avoid going out at night and report any incident to the security team.

While at the venue, participants should ensure that they:

- Wear their conference badge visibly and show it to any authorized person who asks to see it
- Do not leave bags or parcels unattended, as they may be confiscated and destroyed
- Do not bring unauthorized persons, including children, into the conference facilities
- Look after their valuables
- Check that they have all their documents and personal items before leaving the conference halls and meeting rooms
- Inform the ECA Security and Safety Service officer on duty if they lose anything valuable

When at the hotel, participants should follow this safety advice:

- Upon entering and leaving the hotel room, make sure that the door is locked
- Before leaving, inspect the hotel room to make sure that no money, jewellery, cameras or other valuables are visible
- Deposit valuables or any other important portable items at the reception desk and ask for a receipt, or leave them in the safe in the hotel room
- Inform the ECA Security and Safety Service if anything suspicious or out of the ordinary is observed

About Ethiopia

Ethiopia is an expansive, landlocked country in the Horn of Africa. It is a multi-ethnic State in which 83 languages and 200 dialects are spoken. Agriculture is the backbone of the economy, and the principal exports from the sector are coffee, oil seeds, pulses, flowers, vegetables, sugar and animal feed. About 90 per cent of the population earns a living from the land. There is also a vibrant livestock sector, exports from which include cattle, hides and skins.

Climate

Ethiopia has two main seasons. The dry season is from October to May, and the rainy season starts in late June and ends in September. Temperatures vary depending on the season and altitude. Since there is a possibility of cool weather at night and after heavy rains, participants may wish to bring a jacket or sweater with them.

Time zone

The time zone is UTC+3 all year long.

Selected tourist attractions in Addis Ababa

Name of attraction	Description
National Museum of Ethiopia	A centre of history and culture in the capital, the National Museum of Ethiopia presents the ancient legacy of not only Ethiopia but all humankind. The museum features many archaeological artefacts discovered locally, such as fossil remains and skeletons. Many works of art by Ethiopian artists are displayed, alongside ancient relics of some of the first-known hominids and ethnological artefacts from across the centuries.
Holy Trinity Cathedral	The construction of this massive and ornate cathedral began in 1936 and was completed in 1944, during the reign of Emperor Haile Selassie I. It is one of the best-designed churches in Ethiopia and is notable for its architecture, decoration, spaciousness and splendid stained-glass windows. In addition, it is the burial place of Haile Selassie and many other dignitaries. There is also a small museum on the grounds, which houses over 140 religious manuscripts, icons, ceremonial items, paintings, umbrellas, crosses and books dating from as far back as the fifteenth century.
Entoto Natural Park	Part of the "Beautifying Sheger" project, Entoto Natural Park is a highland park that sits nearly 3,000 m above sea level. The large park is spread out across an often sunny but cold and windy mountain, and has many high-quality cafés, restaurants, hotels and even a new art museum on its grounds. The brainchild of Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed, Entoto Natural Park is now among the most attractive places in Addis Ababa. Many world-class Ethiopian athletes train there.
Unity Park	Unity Park is home to the National Palace, which is a whole world unto itself. There are many things to see and experience in Unity Park, including nature, wildlife, history and architecture. It is a place where visitors can come face-to-face with more than a century of Ethiopian history.
Science Museum	A new addition to the capital, Science Museum is among the most modern and unique buildings in Addis Ababa. The ultramodern facility, located next to the National Palace and Unity Park, is a tourist attraction on its own. The newly opened museum contains 30 interactive exhibits on a diverse range of scientific subjects. The roof of the museum is also accessible and serves as a platform for viewing the modern skyline of Addis Ababa.
Merkato	Merkato is the largest open-air market in Africa. There is a saying in Addis Ababa: "There is nothing that you cannot find in Merkato!" That is true, as there are thousands of vendors and street traders selling any commodity imaginable. Although the stalls and shopfronts may seem unprepossessing, transactions worth billions of birr take place there every day.
