1. Joint opening of the ninth session of the Statistical Commission for Africa and the tenth meeting of the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa

The joint segment will begin at 9 a.m. (Addis Ababa time (UTC+3)) on Wednesday, 30 October 2024. The session will begin with welcoming remarks by the Director of the African Centre for Statistics, which is the secretariat of the Statistical Commission for Africa and the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa.

That will be followed by statements delivered by the Chairs of each of the two Bureaux. The session will be opened officially with one address delivered by the Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission for Africa, Claver Gatete, and another given by the [President of Ethiopia, Sahle-Work Zewde – TBC].

The joint segment will continue with statements given by three special guests.

4. Transformation and modernization of statistical systems in Africa

During this session, pertinent guidance on how to transform and modernize official statistics in Africa will be highlighted. A representative of the secretariat will introduce the report, after which participants will be invited to join a discussion, which will be focused on the opportunities presented by specific initiatives that strengthen the capacities of national statistical systems and on how African States can harness such opportunities to accelerate their statistical transformation and modernization.

5. Joint segment with the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa

In this segment, participants will reflect further on the overlap between the fields of geospatial information and statistics, illustrated by case studies, will take stock of current progress in modernizing national mapping activities in Africa and will share national experiences.

6. Reports on preliminary and side events and related meetings

The organizers of the preliminary events held on 28 and 29 October will provide oral reports on the proceedings and outcomes of those events. The ensuing discussion will provide participants in the plenary session of the Statistical Commission for Africa with an opportunity to discuss two to three of the recommendations made in those reports.
