Information note for participants**I. Overview**

The tenth session of the Statistical Commission for Africa, the twelfth meeting of the Regional Committee of United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management for Africa, and the twelfth meeting of the Forum on African Statistical Development will be held at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa from 21 to 23 October, from 19 to 23 October, and on 20 October 2026, respectively. The present document contains general information on meeting arrangements that may be helpful for those planning to travel to and participate in the events.

IV. Visa and immigration requirements

All participants travelling to Ethiopia must hold a passport that is valid for a minimum period of six months from the date of intended entry and contains at least two consecutive empty visa pages.

Participants who intend to obtain a visa upon arrival at Addis Ababa Bole International Airport should send the secretariat the following documents by 1 October 2026:

- Copy of passport
- Flight details (arrival and departure information)
- Name of hotel booked

Such participants should carry with them their personal official letter of invitation and a copy of the note verbale listing the names of meeting participants. They should be prepared to present those documents at the check-in desk at the airport of departure and to the immigration authorities of Ethiopia upon arrival. The application fee for a single-entry 30-day conference visa is \$52. For additional information on conference visas, see www.evisa.gov.et/information/conferenceVisa.

The application procedure for journalist visas is the same as described above. The fee is \$152 for a single-entry 30-day journalist visa. For additional information on journalist visas, see www.evisa.gov.et/information/journalistvisa.

ECA will send a note verbale to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ethiopia and the Immigration, Nationality and Vital Events Agency of Ethiopia to facilitate the issuance of visas upon arrival for all confirmed participants. The note verbale will be shared with confirmed participants to support their request for a visa.

Sponsored participants should note that visa fees are covered by the daily subsistence allowance and will not be reimbursed.

Holders of diplomatic and service passports or a United Nations laissez-passer will receive a visa upon arrival free of charge.

Bank receipts for money exchanged at the airport must be kept secure, as they may be requested by officials at the airport upon departure.

V. Airport transfers and transport to the meeting venue

Participants should contact the hotel at which they have chosen to stay to arrange transfer from the airport to the hotel.

There are no daily transport arrangements to and from the meeting venue, and participants are responsible for organizing their own transport.

VI. Hotel accommodation

All participants travelling to Ethiopia must contact hotels directly to arrange, confirm and guarantee their bookings. Special United Nations rates for hotel rooms have been negotiated for the hotels listed in annex I to the present information note. The deadline for confirming reservations at these hotels is 5 October 2026. Reservations that have not been confirmed by that deadline will be released. After that date, hotels will accept accommodation requests on the basis of the availability of rooms.

All participants are kindly requested to note that ECA will not be able to arrange hotel accommodation if participants fail to make their own arrangements beforehand.

VII. Registration and identification badges

A. Online registration

B. Badges

Participants are required to have a valid badge that must be presented to access the venue. Badges can be collected beginning on 19 October 2026 in the Delegate Registration Building, to which participants will be directed upon entering the ECA compound at Gate 2.

For security reasons, badges must be displayed at all times. Lost badges should be immediately reported at the registration counter.

VIII. Facilities and services at the venue

A. Accessibility

IX. Practical information

A. Currency

The official currency of Ethiopia is the Ethiopian birr. One United States dollar is equivalent to approximately 160 birr. Credit and debit cards, such as American Express, Diners Club International, Mastercard and Visa, are accepted in Ethiopia. Automatic cash machines are also available.

B. Time zone

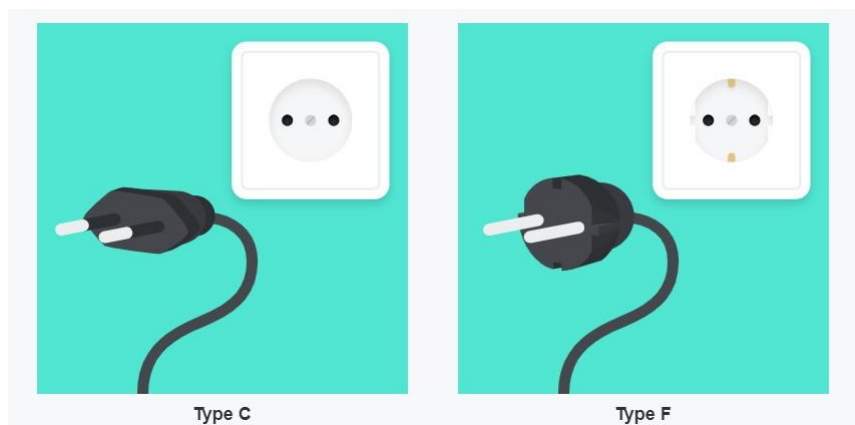
The time zone is UTC+3 all year long.

C. Electricity supply and voltage

The electricity supply in Ethiopia is 220 V with a frequency of 50 Hz alternating current. Plug types C and F are used, as shown in the figure.

D. Mobile phone services

Ethio Telecom and Safaricom are the main mobile phone companies in the country. They offer prepaid SIM cards and have roaming agreements with partners in many countries. In order to activate a SIM card, the purchaser must register at the time of purchase. Participants will need to show their passports when buying a SIM card from an authorized vendor. SIM cards and telephone credit can be purchased at the airport.

E. Health and insurance

1. Pre-travel planning and vaccinations

Before your departure, please ensure that you are up to date with routine immunizations and travel vaccines. A yellow fever vaccination certificate is strictly required by the Ethiopian authorities if you are arriving from or transiting through a country with a risk of yellow fever transmission. Please

bring a sufficient supply of any medications to last the entirety of your stay. Specific brands or specialist formulations may not be readily available on the local market.

2. Altitude and weather

Addis Ababa is situated approximately 2,400 metres (7,874 feet) above sea level. The high altitude can cause mild symptoms such as headaches, fatigue or mild shortness of breath during your first few days. This risk is heightened for individuals with pre-existing cardiovascular or respiratory conditions. Drink plenty of water and avoid overexertion upon arrival.

Ethiopia has two main seasons. The dry season is from October to May, and the rainy season starts in late June and ends in September. Temperatures can vary considerably depending on the season and altitude and between daytime and evening. Participants are advised to bring clothing that is suitable for cool evenings and early mornings. Participants may also wish to bring a waterproof jacket and an umbrella in case of rain.

3. Food, water and gastrointestinal health

Waterborne and food-borne illnesses may occur periodically. Strict adherence to personal hygiene minimizes this risk. Avoid tap water completely. Drink only bottled water with an intact, factory-sealed cap or water that has been boiled. Avoid ice unless you know it has been made from safe drinking water. Only eat food that is freshly cooked and served hot. Avoid raw or undercooked meat. Wash your hands regularly with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer (at least 60 per cent alcohol), as appropriate.

4. Malaria

Because Addis Ababa sits well above 2,000 metres, there is virtually no risk of malaria transmission within the city itself. Preventive antimalarial medication is generally not required if your travel itinerary is strictly limited to the city. However, if you plan to travel to areas outside Addis Ababa with an elevation below 2,000 metres, there is a higher risk of malaria. In that case, you should consult a travel clinic about appropriate antimalarial medication and use insect repellent consistently.

5. Healthcare

The United Nations Healthcare Centre is located within the ECA compound in Addis Ababa and available to conference participants for acute and emergency healthcare needs on a cost-recovery basis. Regular clinic services are available weekdays from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with an emergency hotline available outside those hours and throughout the weekend (see annex II).

Emergency response and public ambulance services in Addis Ababa can be highly limited. Travellers are advised to use reputable private hospitals within the city, a list of which may be found in annex II.

6. Insurance

Participants are strictly responsible for arranging at their own expense appropriate health, travel and any other insurance they consider necessary for the entire duration of their stay. Please ensure your travel insurance explicitly covers international medical evacuation.

F. Security

Addis Ababa is a relatively safe city for travellers. Adequate security will be provided at the venue and the recommended hotels. Visitors are advised to

stay alert, maintain a low profile, avoid going anywhere alone or at night when possible and report any incident to the security team.

While at the venue, participants should ensure that they:

- Wear their conference badge visibly and show it to any authorized person who asks to see it.
- Do not leave bags or parcels unattended, as they may be confiscated and destroyed.
- Do not bring unauthorized persons, including children, into the conference facilities.
- Look after their valuables.
- Check that they have all their documents and personal items before leaving conference halls and meeting rooms.
- Inform the ECA Security and Safety Service officer on duty if they lose anything valuable.

When at their hotels, participants should:

- Make sure that the door is locked on entering and leaving the hotel room.
- Before leaving the hotel room, make sure that no money, jewellery, cameras or other valuables are visible.
- Deposit valuables or any other important items at the reception desk and ask for a receipt, or leave them in the safe in the hotel room.
- Inform the ECA Security and Safety Service if they see anything suspicious or unusual.

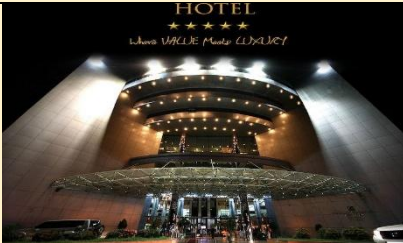

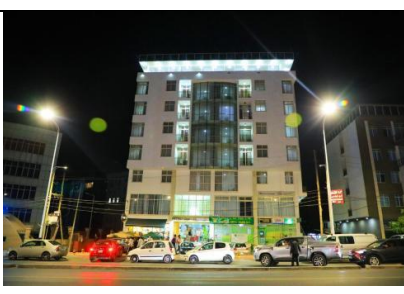

Selected tourist attractions in Addis Ababa

<i>Name of attraction</i>	<i>Description</i>
National Museum of Ethiopia	A centre of history and culture in the capital, the National Museum of Ethiopia presents the ancient legacy of not only Ethiopia but all humankind. The museum features many archaeological artefacts discovered locally, such as fossil remains and skeletons. Many works of art by Ethiopian artists are displayed, alongside ancient relics of some of the first-known hominids and ethnological artefacts from across the centuries.
Holy Trinity Cathedral	The construction of this massive and ornate cathedral began in 1936 and was completed in 1944, during the reign of Emperor Haile Selassie I. It is one of the best-designed churches in Ethiopia and is notable for its architecture, decoration, spaciousness and splendid stained-glass windows. In addition, it is the burial place of Haile Selassie and many other dignitaries. There is also a small museum on the grounds, which houses over 140 religious manuscripts, icons, ceremonial items, paintings, umbrellas, crosses and books dating from as far back as the fifteenth century.
Entoto Natural Park	Part of the “Beautifying Sheger” project, Entoto Natural Park is a highland park that sits nearly 3,000 m above sea level. The large park is spread out across an often sunny but cold and windy mountain, and has many high-quality cafés, restaurants, hotels and even a new art museum on its grounds. The brainchild of Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed, Entoto Natural Park is now among the most attractive places in Addis Ababa. Many world-class Ethiopian athletes train there.
Unity Park	Unity Park is home to the National Palace, which is a whole world unto itself. There are many things to see and experience in Unity Park, including nature, wildlife, history and architecture. It is a place where visitors can come face-to-face with more than a century of Ethiopian history.
Science Museum	A new addition to the capital, the Science Museum is among the most modern and unique buildings in Addis Ababa. The ultramodern facility, located next to the National Palace and Unity Park, is a tourist attraction on its own. The newly opened museum contains 30 interactive exhibits on a diverse range of scientific subjects. The roof of the museum is also accessible and serves as a platform for viewing the modern skyline of Addis Ababa.
Merkato	Merkato is the largest open-air market in Africa. There is a saying in Addis Ababa: “There is nothing that you cannot find in Merkato!” That is true, as there are thousands of vendors and street traders selling any commodity imaginable. Although the stalls and shopfronts may seem unprepossessing, transactions worth billions of birr are carried out there every day.
